Action Taken Report by The Principal On the basis of the Feedback Collected from the Students, the Alumni and the Teachers

Infrastructural Upgradation recognizing the importance of a conducive learning environment, the college has implemented numerous infrastructural upgrades, including:

- > **Canteen:** Establishment of a new canteen with seating arrangements.
- Repairing: Classroom furniture, canteen furniture has been completed which was damaged due to closure during look down.
- Cleaning duty roster: Implementation of the duty roster for cleanliness maintenance demonstrates a focus on creating a hygienic and pleasant environment conducive to learning and productivity.
- Repair and Servicing of lights: Fans, and pedestal fans to beat the heat and provision for one additional fan in each room under process.
- Student Common Room: Provision of common rooms with indoor games for student recreation is under process.
- Installation of new CCTV: CCTV cameras which was not functioning after the pandemic was repaired and reinstalled. New camera and a led TV were also purchased to enhance security on campus.
- Optimizing Space Usage: Utilizing an extra room with AC facilities for multiple purposes, such as a NAAC room and a rest area for teachers, maximizes the utility of available space. This adaptive approach ensures that resources are used efficiently to meet various needs
- Ramps have been installed to provide support to the especially abled teachers and students.

- Technological Upgrades: Procuring more overhead projectors reflects a commitment to modernizing teaching methods and enhancing classroom experiences. Ensuring that each department has access to this technology promotes consistency and equity across different areas of study.
- Air conditioners: Installation of AC has been installed in Room no 101, Principals Room and staff room.

Action Taken Report By IQAC On the Basis Of the Feed Back Collected From the Students, Alumni And Teachers

- Formation of clubs: Various Clubs have been formed to support students in learning differently, such as debate club, cine club, literary club, photography club etc. Photography Club, has provided a platform for students to explore their skills and talents in different college activities. The Photography Club, in particular, serves as the official photographer of the College, capturing memorable moments and enhancing the overall college experience. Through these clubs, we aim to empower students by providing them with opportunities for self-expression and personal growth.
- Add-On Courses: offered by various departments are designed to facilitate students' fun learning while deepening their understanding and practice in specific areas. For example, the BFA Department offers courses and platforms for students to develop as young entrepreneurs. The souvenirs used by the college for any occasion are products manufactured by them, showcasing their entrepreneurial skills and creativity. 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

Academic improvements, the college has focused on enhancing the teaching-learning process through various initiatives:

- Academic Audit: All the Departments were asked to update the record of the department since the session 2016-17 till May2023 for the Academic Audit to be conducted by the College

With the implementation of the CBCS system the mode of evaluation varied department wise. - Google Classroom: Utilization of platforms like Google Classroom for sharing notes and e-content was encouraged and all departments have Google Classroom for all classes.
